

ACADEMIC PREVENTION/INTERVENTION SERVICES

The Board of Education authorizes and directs the Superintendent to conduct academic prevention/intervention services for all grades and all schools throughout the District. Such prevention/intervention services shall include, but are not limited to, all of the following:

- A. Use of diagnostic assessments to measure student progress toward the attainment of academic standards and to identify students who may not attain academic standards;
- B. Classroom-based intervention services to meet the instructional needs of individual students as determined by the results of diagnostic assessments;
- C. The regular collection of student performance data;
- D. Use of student performance data to evaluate the effectiveness of intervention services and, if necessary, to modify such services;
- E. Required prevention/intervention services set forth in O.R.C. §§3301.0711; 3301.0715; and 3301.608.

The specific intervention services to be supplied by the district are as follows:

- 1. The majority of intervention services will be provided by the classroom teacher.
- 2. The classroom teacher, with assistance from the Intervention Assistance Team, will plan specific interventions designed to assist the individual student in need.
- 3. In the case of students who are suspected to have a disability, a multi-factored assessment will be administered or a Section 504 plan will be written.
- 4. At schools that qualify for Title I funding, intervention services will be provided to those students who qualify for Title I services.

Prevention/intervention services shall be provided in pertinent subject areas to students who score below the proficient level on a reading, writing, mathematics, or science achievement test or who do not demonstrate academic performance at their grade level based on the results of a diagnostic assessment.

Intervention services shall also be provided to students whose diagnostic assessments show that they are failing to make satisfactory progress toward attaining the academic standards for their grade level.

The Superintendent or designee shall submit results of diagnostic assessments to the Ohio Department of Education in the prescribed manner. This policy shall be updated annually.
